

## GETTING TO UNIVERSITY PARK

**BY AIR:** Many students from overseas arrive at the University Park Airport located in State College, Pennsylvania (destination code "SCE") by air. The airport is serviced by Delta Connection, U. S. Airways Express, United Express, and Northwest AirlinK. There are daily flights to University Park Airport from cities throughout the region such as Philadelphia, Detroit, Cincinnati, and Washington. Since your travel arrangements will include flights within the U.S., you should ask to be ticketed through to University Park Airport (SCE). A ticket purchased separately after your arrival in the U.S. will cost more.

**BY BUS:** Bus service to State College is available from New York City, Washington, Philadelphia, Harrisburg, and Pittsburgh, with connections in Pittsburgh from the west. There are usually two or three arrivals per day from these cities. In most major cities, buses depart from downtown terminals; airport shuttles are available from the airport to these terminals. Two bus companies, Fullington Trailways and Greyhound Lines, have connections to and from State College. More information is available from them at:

**BY TRAIN:** The U.S. train system, Amtrak, stops nearest to State College at Lewistown, approximately 30 miles to the east, and Altoona, some 45 miles to the southwest, with two trains arriving from the east and the west each day. Of the two, Altoona is the best if you will be transferring to the bus; Lewistown is closer if someone with a car will be meeting your train. Harrisburg is also a good connection point since the train and bus stations are in the same location. For more information, visit the Amtrak web site, <http://www.amtrak.com>.

### BY AUTOMOBILE:

**From New York City,** the suggested route is via the George Washington Bridge to I-80. In Pennsylvania, exit from I-80 at new Exit #161 (old Exit #24) at Bellefonte and follow PA Route 220 south to State College.

**From Philadelphia,** there are two routes. Take the Northeast Extension of the Pennsylvania Turnpike to I-80 to new Exit #161 (old Exit #24) at Bellefonte and follow Route 26 to State College; or take the Schuylkill Expressway to the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Use new Exit #247 (old Exit #19) at Harrisburg East, follow I-283 to I-83 and proceed north on I-83 to the I-81 interchange. Then follow I-81 west to the exit Route 322/22 west. Proceed west on Route 322 through Lewistown to State College.

**From Pittsburgh,** follow Route 22 East to Duncansville. Then take Route 220/I-99 East, bypassing downtown Altoona and Tyrone. After Port Matilda, take Route 322 East to State College.

**From Washington, DC,** several routes are available. Take I-270 to Frederick, I-70 to Breezewood, the PA turnpike (exit 12) west to Bedford (exit 11), I-99 north to Rt. 220, and Route 322 East to State College; or take I-95 (or the Baltimore-Washington Parkway) to Baltimore, west loop I-695 to I-83 north, I-83 north to the I-81 interchange, I-81 west to Route 322, and Route 322 west to State College.

Once in State College, follow the exit signs off Route 322 to Penn State; or take Atherton Street from the north or south until you reach the campus, located in the center of town on either side of Atherton. At the Nittany Lion Inn, turn east on Park Avenue; turn right on to Bigler Road; then right on to Pollock Road; Boucke Building is the second on the right after the Shortlidge intersection. Whether on or off campus, be sure to pay meter charges and observe all parking regulations.
